LET THERE BE LIGHT!

As previously reported in these pages, the North Star Museum was the beneficiary of a \$50,000 Arts and Cultural Heritage Legacy Grant in 2012. The funds were given to update the Museum's lighting and also to reduce harmful ultraviolet light entering the galleries. Thanks to the efforts of Board members Bill Rust and Tom Welna, the project was bid out in late 2012, bids were received, and a contractor selected.

Because the bids came in higher than expected, Museum volunteers did the demolition work. Additional money was saved when we scrapped the nearly 2000 pounds of removed metal light fixtures. Mike Lund spent a good deal of time moving exhibits around as the construction progressed. With the work now done, oh what a difference it makes! The re-lit Guthmann Family Gallery is now ready for you to pay a visit. Let us know what you think of the beautiful golden glow of our new lighting.
